Below are the details of the up-coming events for May 2019.

Now is the time our beautiful greenways are getting greener and so it is a great time to explore sections on foot.

I am pleased to say that litter levels on both the Floop and most of the Yellow Brick Road are not bad at the moment but as I have been told many, many times, one can never win as far as litter is concerned, so the battle must continue. However, now that most of the 'old litter' has been dealt with, little and often is the key which is why I appeal to you to try and join us now and again if you can.

The Thursday litter pick this month will **not** be on the Floop as such but will be on the southern end of the Yellow Brick Road including where the Yellow Brick Road crosses the Floop. The littering is reasonably light here so it will give you an opportunity for a bit of a walk as well as possibly seeing some new greenway, all while removing some of the nasty stuff. The Saturday litter pick will take on some more serious littering on the Yellow Brick Road up near the Ashton canal. This part has been neglected for quite a time and if you are able to join in to put this right, that would be great.

Yellow Brick Road (Old Stockport Canal) clean-up

When : **Saturday 11th May** at 10.00 am for registering/briefing

Where : Start where Sexa St crosses the YBR - this is north of The Ashton Old Road but south of Claytonbrook Rd where the police HQ is and is accessible by car from Louisa St

Objective : Clear the path north of the Sexa St junction as far as time permits.

Lead volunteer: Roger Bravey has kindly agreed to lead this event as I will be away (again again)

Equipment will be provided as required but suitable clothing and boots should be worn.

Since efficient litter picking often involves working in small groups, we may have a social get-together at the end of the session if there is a demand.

If the weather forecast is particularly bad (e.g. if it looks like continuous heavy rain) then the event may be cancelled at the last minute but this will only be done in exceptional circumstances.
